#### Welcome

Ms. Lisa Hannon, Chair, called the meeting to order at 3:35 p.m. and welcomed everyone.

#### **Financial Update**

Mr. Brent Bishop, Upstate Workforce Board CFO, reviewed the financials through April 2019. No questions were asked.

#### **ACHIEVE Grant Modification**

Mr. Bishop presented the ACHIEVE grant modification to the committee. Mr. Bishop shared that the main reason for the modification was to shift funds within the line items to cover the expense of new student desktop computers. Ms. Rogers motioned to accept the modification as written and Mr. Coffer seconded. Motion passed with no abstentions.

#### **Fall Construction Fair**

Ms. Dana Wood, Upstate Workforce Board COO, stated that she and Ms. Johnnie-Lynn Crosby, SC Works Regional Director of Business Solutions, met with a few local contractors two weeks ago to ask if they felt a fall construction fair would be helpful to the construction industry. The group discussed the potential target age of the students. The group seemed to lean toward 11th/12th graders. It was decided to form a committee of construction industry employers to assist with logistics, sponsorships, etc. It was stressed during the meeting that the Upstate Workforce Board

(staff, Youth Committee and SC Works) would assist this year, but it is expected that industry partners will sustain future events. There were no questions from the committee.

## **PY19 Budget Discussion**

Summary of Options: (see handout)

Ms. Wood reviewed the ACHIEVE and YouthStop Funding Options for PY19. Ms. Wood informed the committee of significant cuts to the youth funding.

Ms. Wood asked each program to share the pros/cons of their proposed budgets.

ACHIEVE: Ms. Helen Merriweather: pros are: with funds they can still offer a program. They will have enough funds to provide for current activities (to include transportation); cons are: will need to cut one van driver (other two drivers will only work 10 months); staff will need to take on responsibilities of the 'cut driver' and Ms. Merriweather will be the only full-time staff member as others will be made part-time.

YouthStop: Ms. Kathy Bell: pros are: none; cons are: YouthStop lost one position last year and will need to make additional staff cuts. This impacts training and work experience and could mean that they go from a full-time program to a shortened program. Concerned about how to implement state mandated salary increases for staff.

Committee discussion: ACHIEVE program is limited to only WIOA money and some small private grants. YouthStop has some support from Spartanburg County School District Six (transportation). Both programs do a wonderful job. It was discussed that both programs serve the same amount of youth participants; expected attendee numbers for PY19 are unknown. The committee deliberated about how to proceed and decided to recommend Funding Option 1 (below).
