

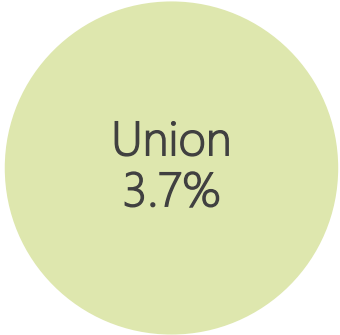

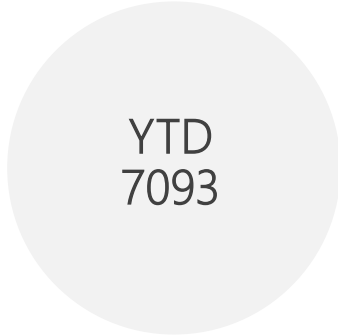

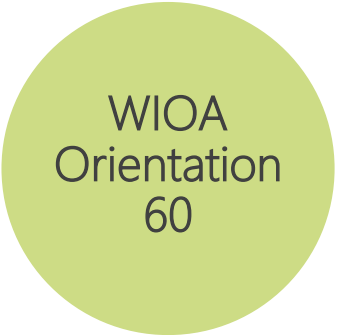
Unemployment Rates

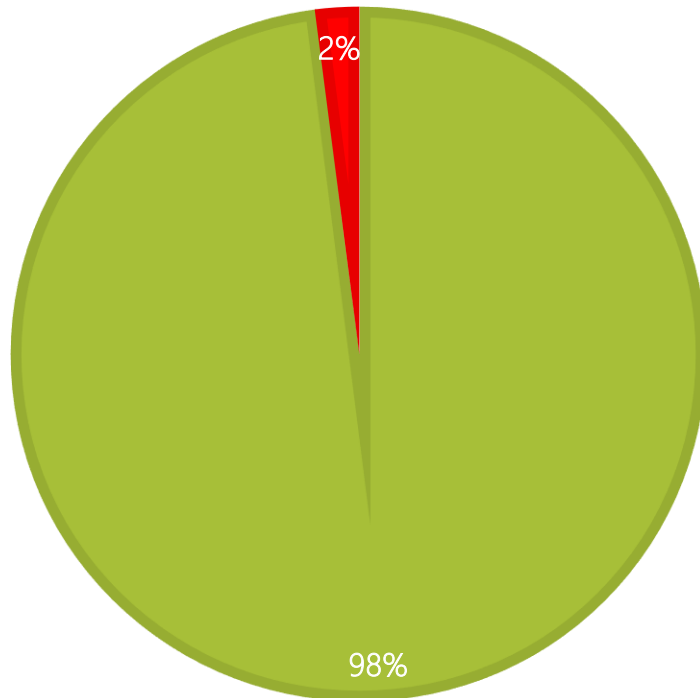

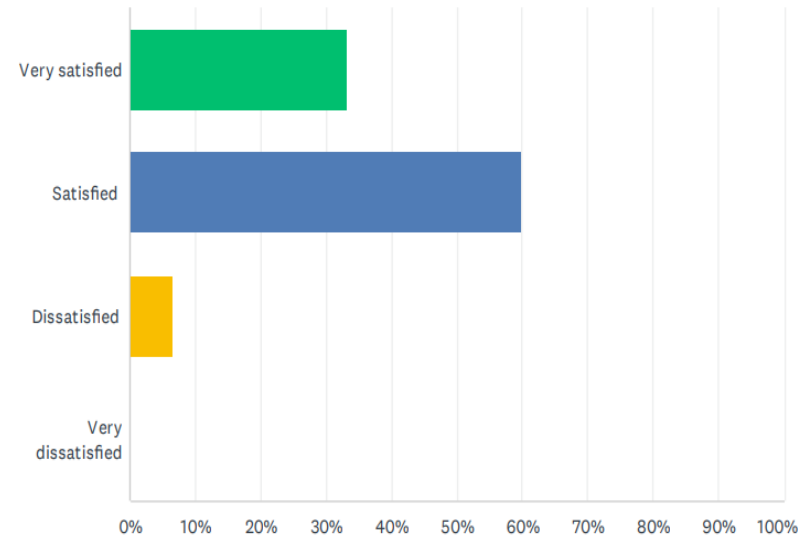

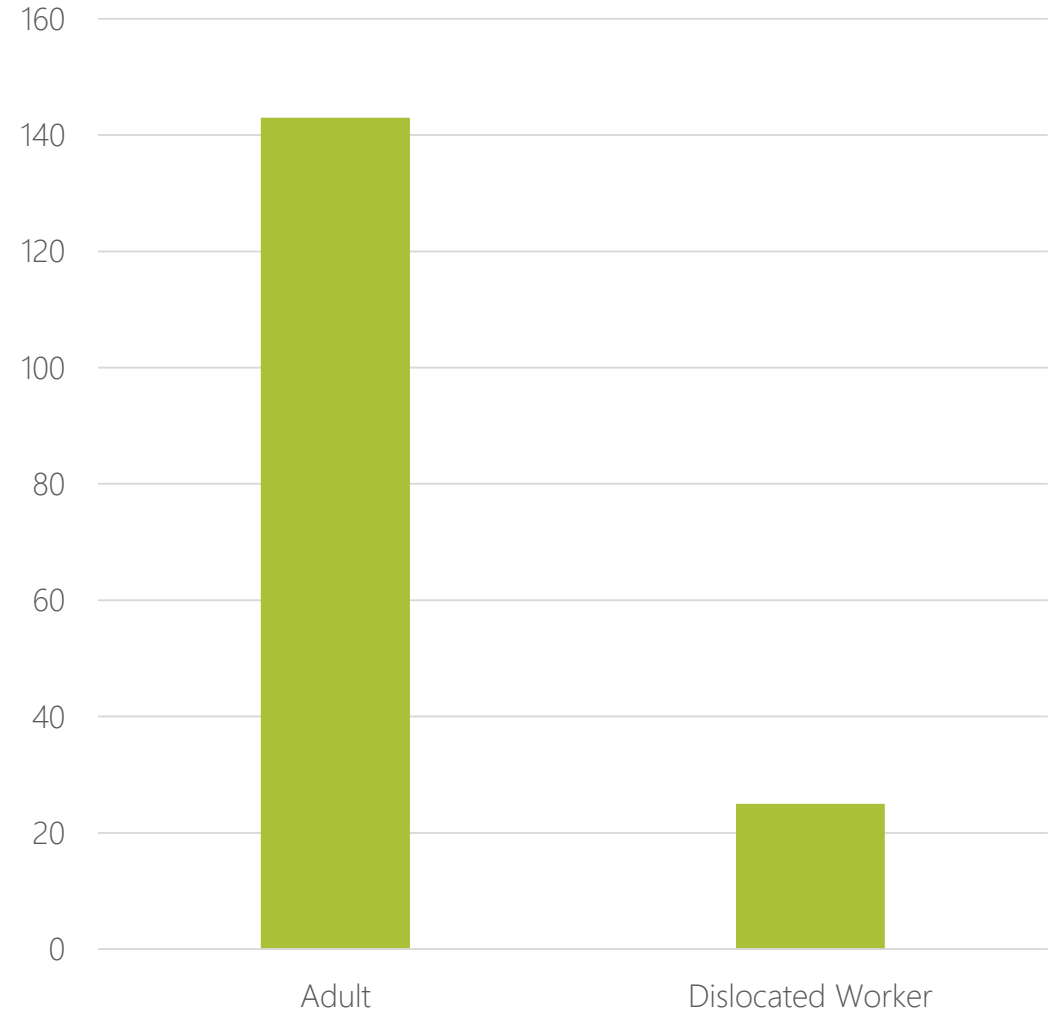

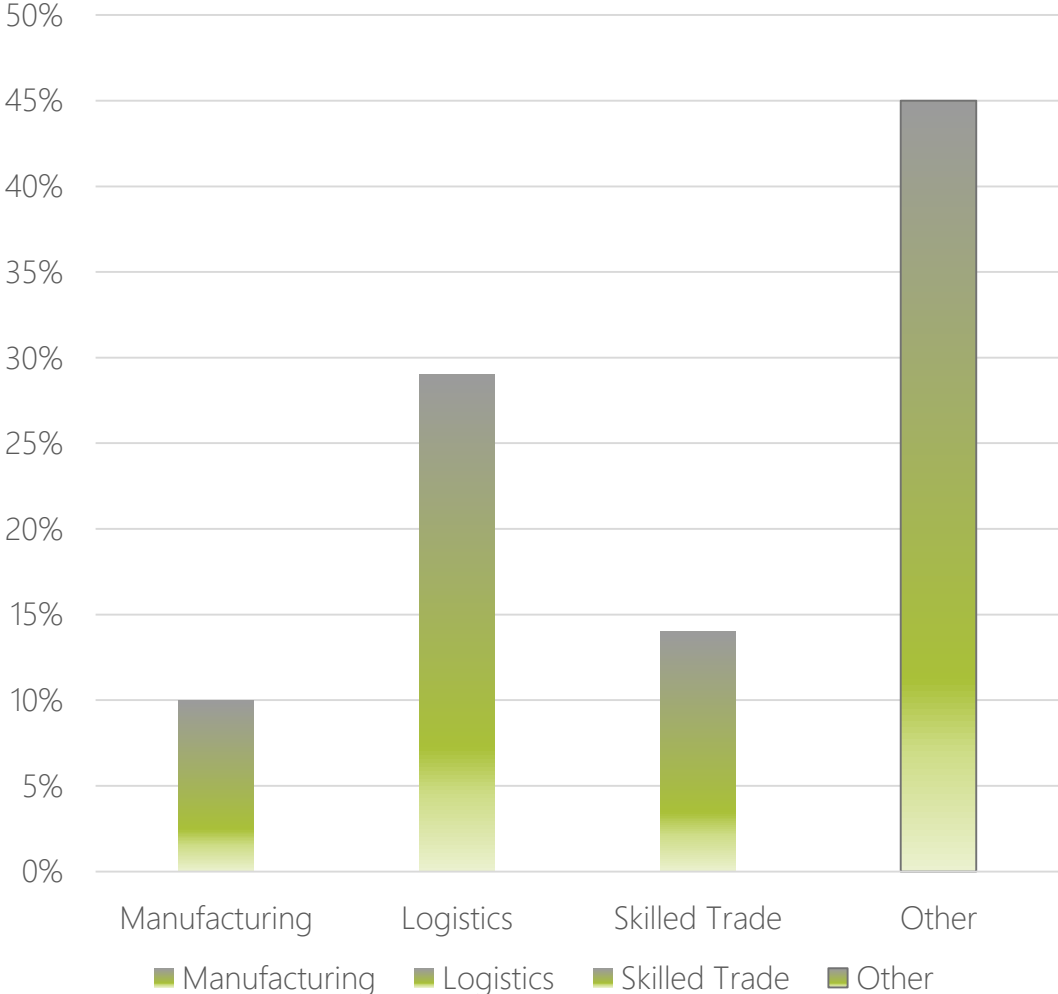

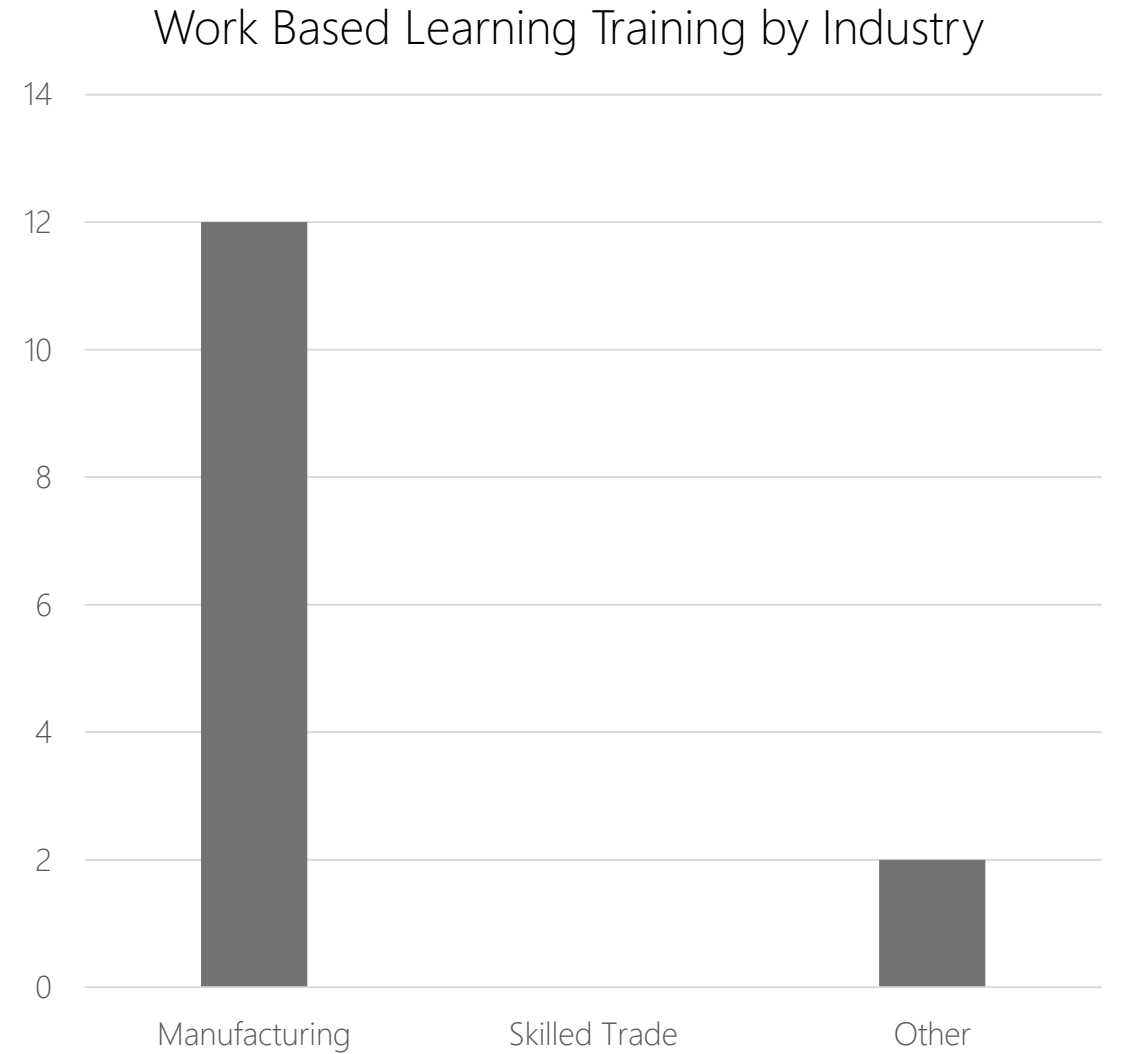


Funding Stream Progress & Industry Percentages

Funding Progress



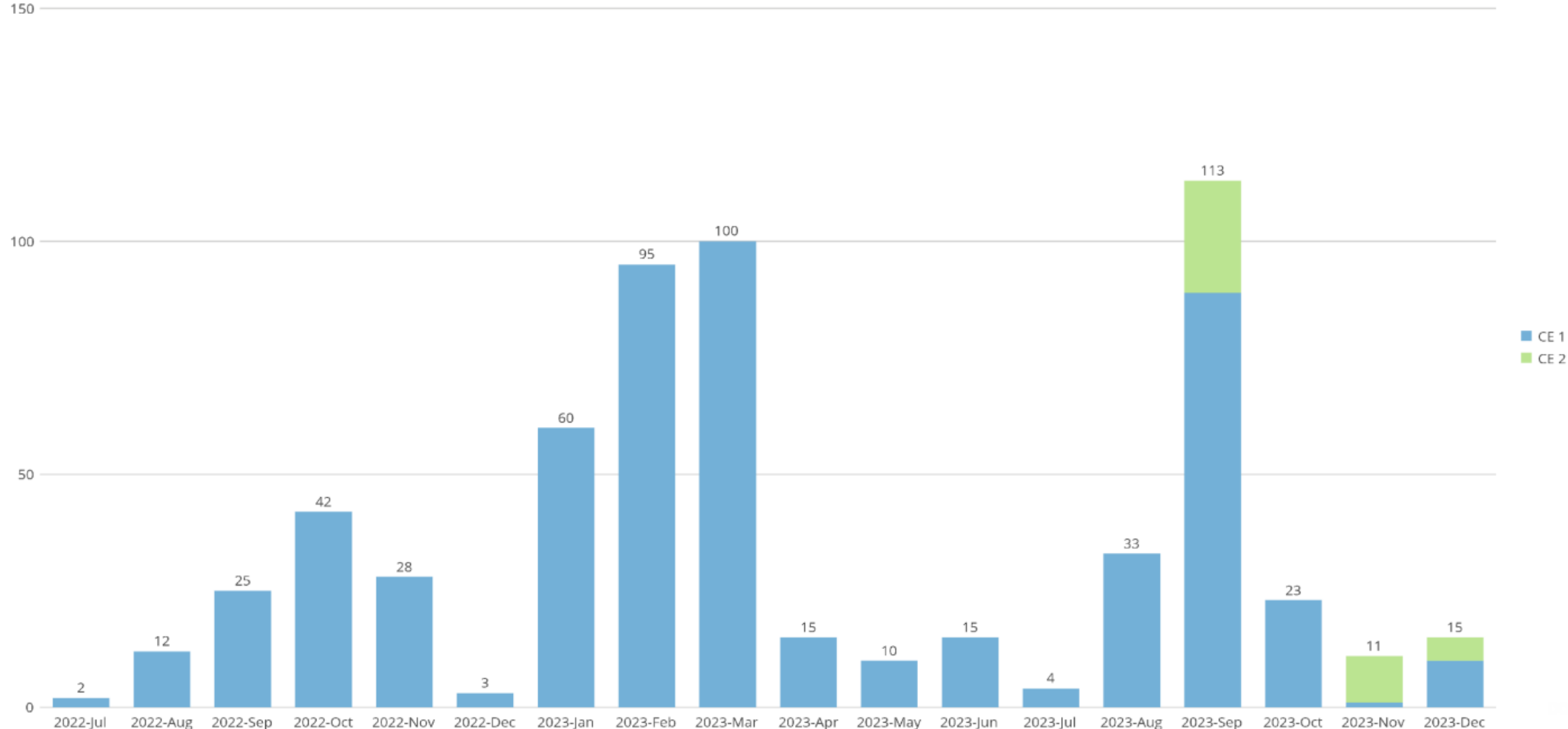

Success Story

Union County Jail participates in a program in which State Trustees are sent to the local area to finish out their sentence and perform daily employment activities to assist the county in areas such as parks & recreation, maintenance and other lines of business. Given the need upskilling to become more marketable once released, SC Works Greater Upstate partnered with Union County Jail, Midlands Technical College and Greenville Technical College to facilitate training to 12 State Trustees.

SC Works Greater Upstate staff worked with the partners mentioned above and identified 12 State Trustees to participate in the program, which consists of NCCER Core Curriculum instruction, both in-person and virtual, once weekly. The County Jail facility has a maintenance shop equipped with tools that have been used during the hands-on, in-person instruction, which greatly assisted in the success of this program in partnership with instructor from Greenville Technical College. Internet was a challenge at first and staff from the County Jail provided a wireless internet device for the days of virtual instruction. The cohort was excited and eager to learn new skills and have passed all modules associated with the NCCER Core Curriculum thus far and will receive a nationwide credential on February 2024. This credential will show growth and development to potential employers once released. This program also provides the Trustees with more confidence within themselves after serving years of time behind bars.

As the Trustees are released, we will continue to provide them with services and connect them to other regions and states based on their desired choice of residency. The cohort is thankful for the opportunity to gain new skills and a credential to add to their resumes which will create more employment opportunities for them in the industry as a justice impacted client.
