Adjusting Participants to Distance Ed Learning

The ACHIEVE participants left class on March 12, like any other Thursday, setting out for a long weekend. By Sunday evening, staff was busy notifying the participants that they would not be picked up on Monday and that we would be in contact. By Tuesday, the distance education began.

ACHIEVE already had an online learning system in place that participants used when not in class and some participants used it if working during class time. The online company revved up its operations and began educating our instructors on how to best serve our participants through distance education. All participants are set up to do online learning, having instructor access hours to call and receive assistance. The instructors are making weekly packets that are delivered by the van drivers and staff and then picked up for instructor assessment. This happens weekly. Instructors are tracking hours through time online (which the instructors can monitor) and completion of study packets.

While the COVID-19 interruption is not time for optimum learning, staff and participants are keeping close contact for support academically and emotionally. Participants have contact numbers for the main ACHIEVE counselor if they need professional therapy. Staff is continually working to keep participants motivated to use this time to get ready for the GED exams when they do become available.
