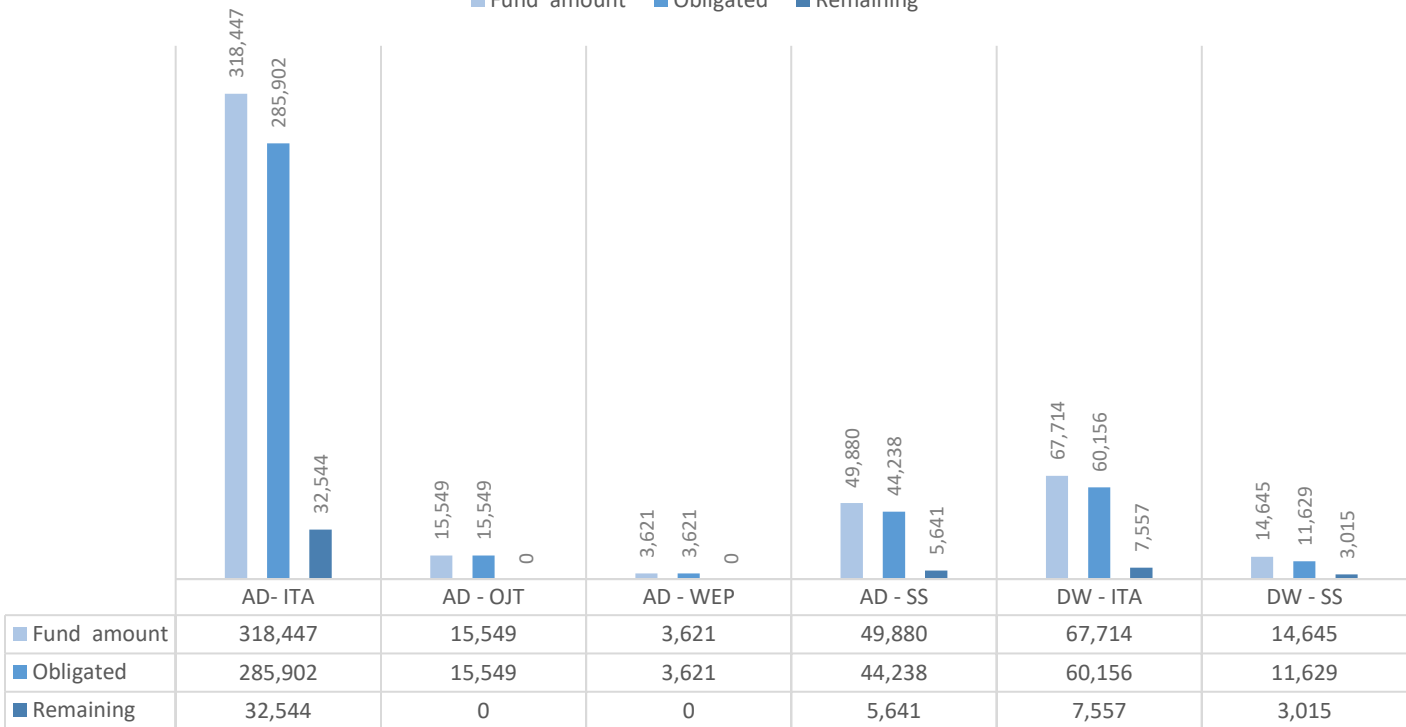

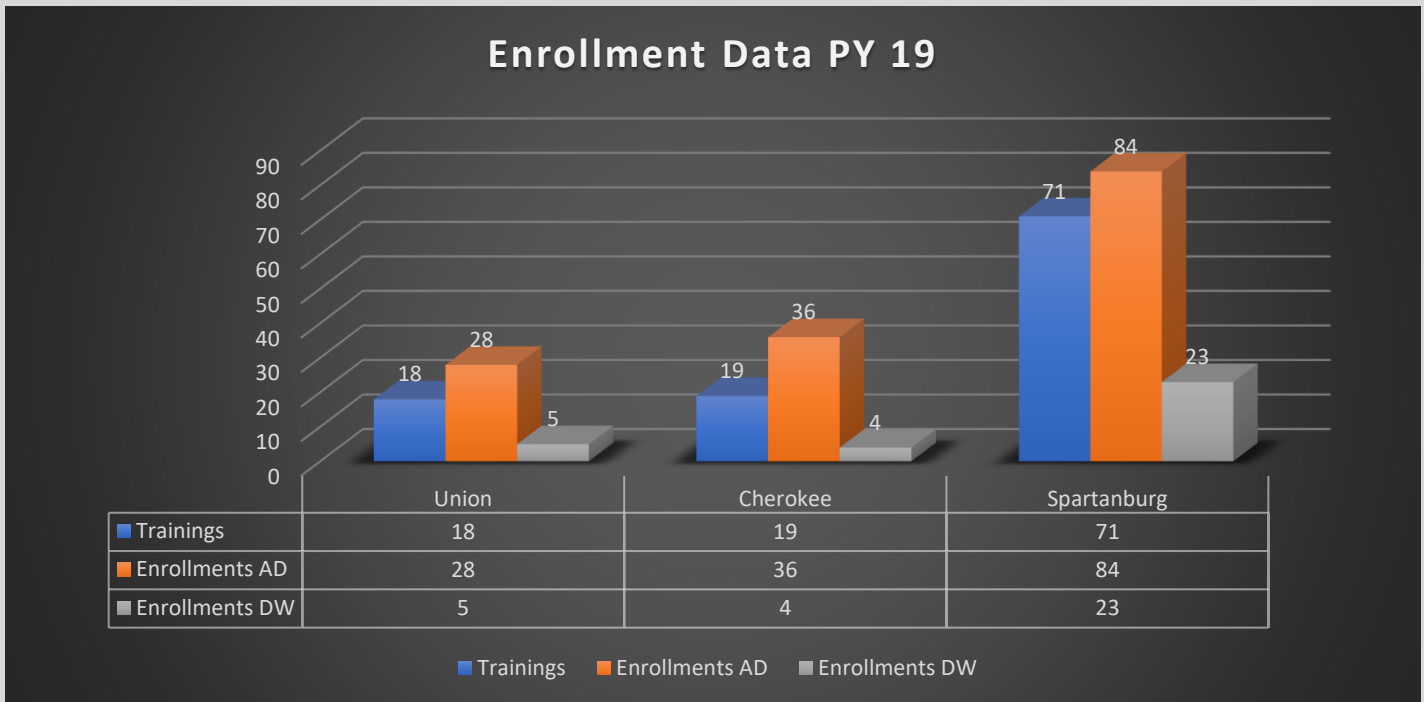

Notables

Nikki attended the TATT Virtual Meeting, the group consisted of various Union County Partners. The group discussed issues and challenges the community is facing due to COVID-19.

JL and Nikki attended the Re-energize Union Recovery Taskforce event hosted in Union County. Employers from various sectors were in attendance and the group discussed the impact COVID-19 has had on businesses. The group will form sub committees and continue to meet.

Nikki attended the Union County Partner Virtual Meeting. There were several partners in attendance, with updates on COVID19 testing, blood drives and other local events. The meetings will be postponed until September 2020.

RDBS attended virtual meeting with Apprenticeship Carolina Consultant and Program Specialist regarding partnership opportunities. (Information Technology and Youth WBL focus)

RDBS provided digital rapid response packets to all 88 affected employees with Toray. The packets encouraged dislocated workers to contact the local centers and provided information on upcoming workshops, unemployment insurance, job openings and job fairs. All affected employees will be paid through August 2020.

RDBS provided virtual platform demo to planning group. The showcase will be held virtually this year, using the Easy Virtual Fairs platform. The event is scheduled to take place in October 2020 for all Upstate 9th graders.

Virtual services continued for many programs, including WIOA Adult/Dislocated Worker staff. Partners operating in the center during June were WIOA Adult/Dislocated Worker, Achieve Youth, Adult Ed and Goodwill GoodStart. Those still working remotely from their main office or from home are DSS, SNAP E&T Coordinator and Goodwill SCSEP's.

**Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act (WIOA)
Success Story**

Name of Participant: Charidy

The Challenge (Background):

Charidy is a single parent of three young children; in addition, she has barriers that hinder employment opportunities. Knowing that she needed to enhance her skillset in order to obtain better employment opportunities and provide for her family, she attended a Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) orientation on January 13, 2020.

The Solution (WIOA Services):

On January 22, 2020, Charidy met with a Talent Development Specialist for one-on-one career counseling and was successfully enrolled in the WIOA Program as an Adult. Charidy was interested and determined to reach her goal of obtaining a Class-A CDL, and she did not waste time completing the program requirements. Charidy completed the WIN Assessment, obtaining a Silver level. The following month on February 11, she completed three ResCare Academy courses and a career pathways Explorer profile. Upon review, Charidy was deemed to have the potential to complete the CDL training program successfully and submitted a WIOA Scholarship Application on February 21. Unfortunately, COVID-19 would delay her start date and duration in training. She persisted and began training at the Truck Driving Institute (TDI) in Richburg, SC on 11 May.

The Outcome

Determined to not let COVID-19 keep her from fulfilling her goal, and with the support of her loving family, Charidy completed training with TDI and obtained her Class-A CDL on 9 June! Shortly after the completion of training, Charidy received a job offer from Walls & Martin Freight making \$23/hour.
