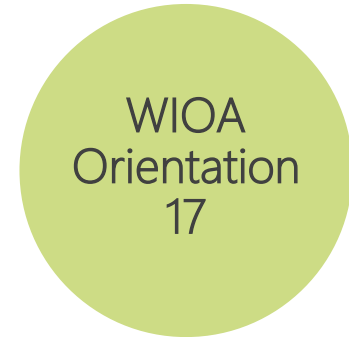
Unemployment Rates

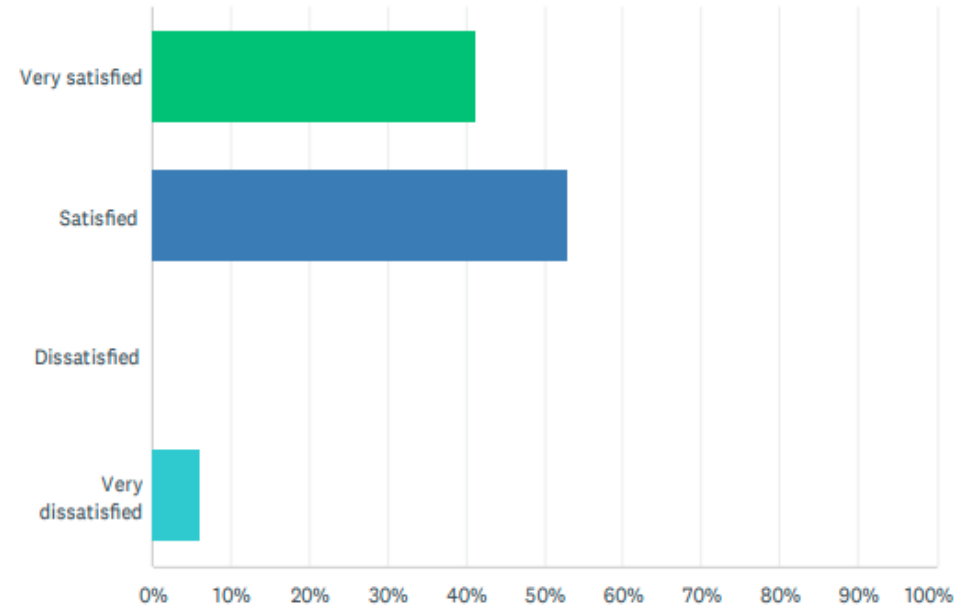

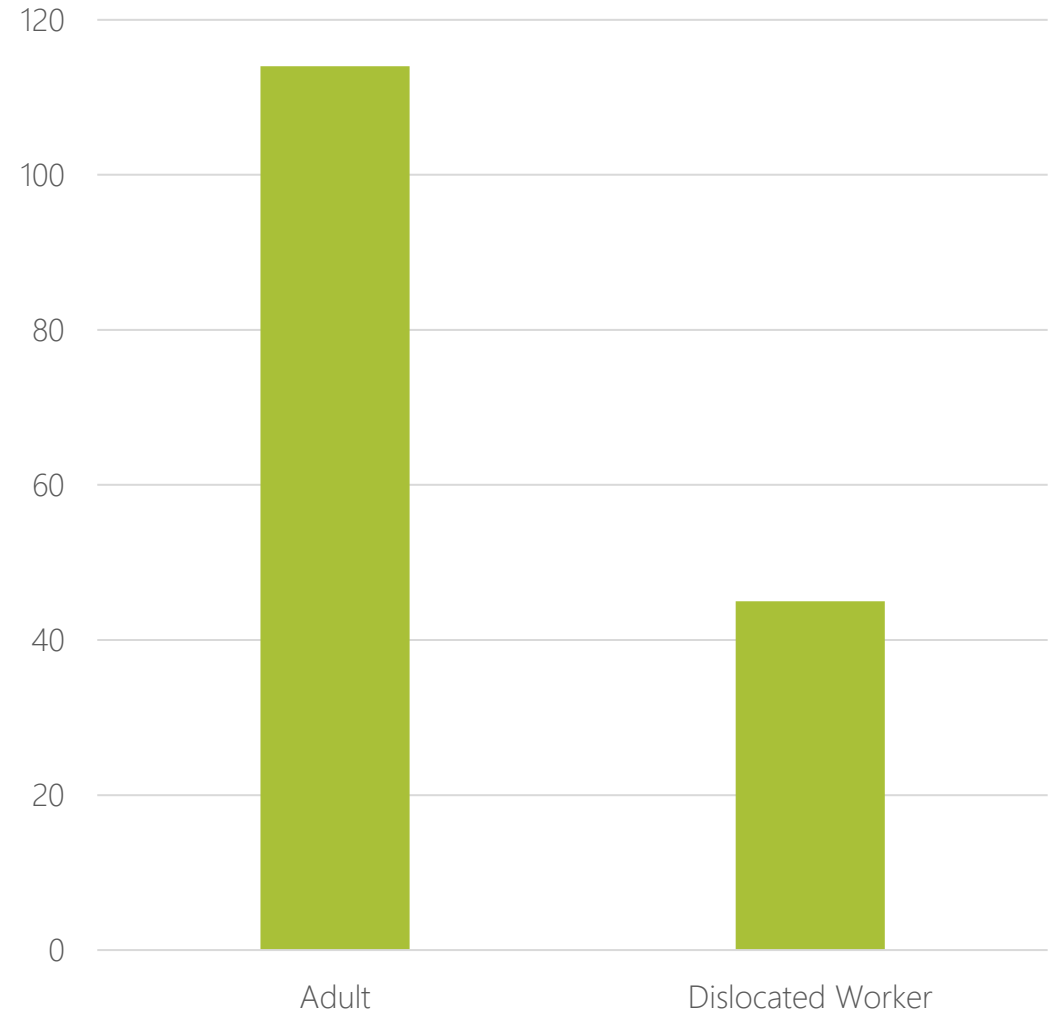

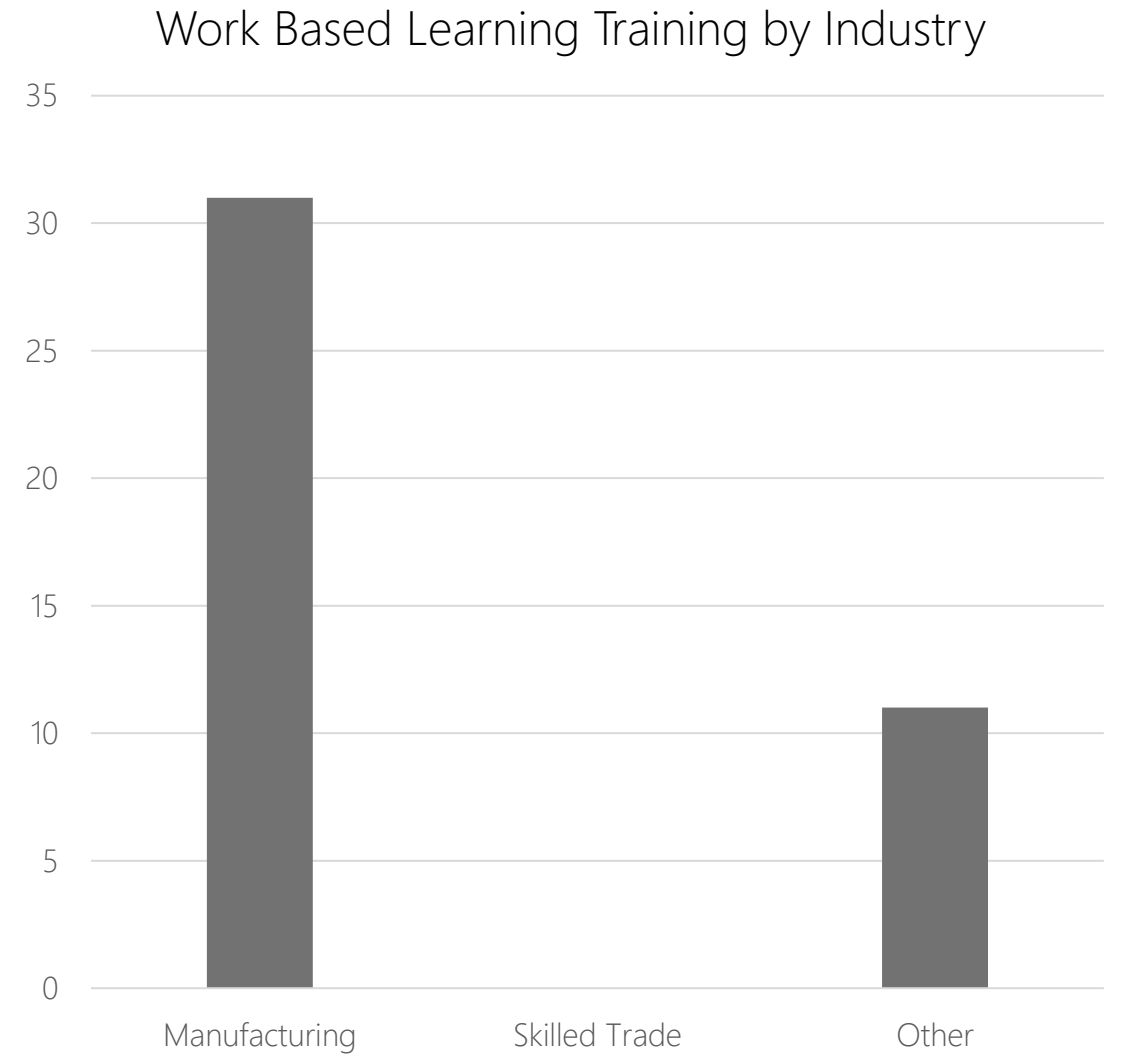


Funding Stream Progress & Industry Percentages

Funding Progress



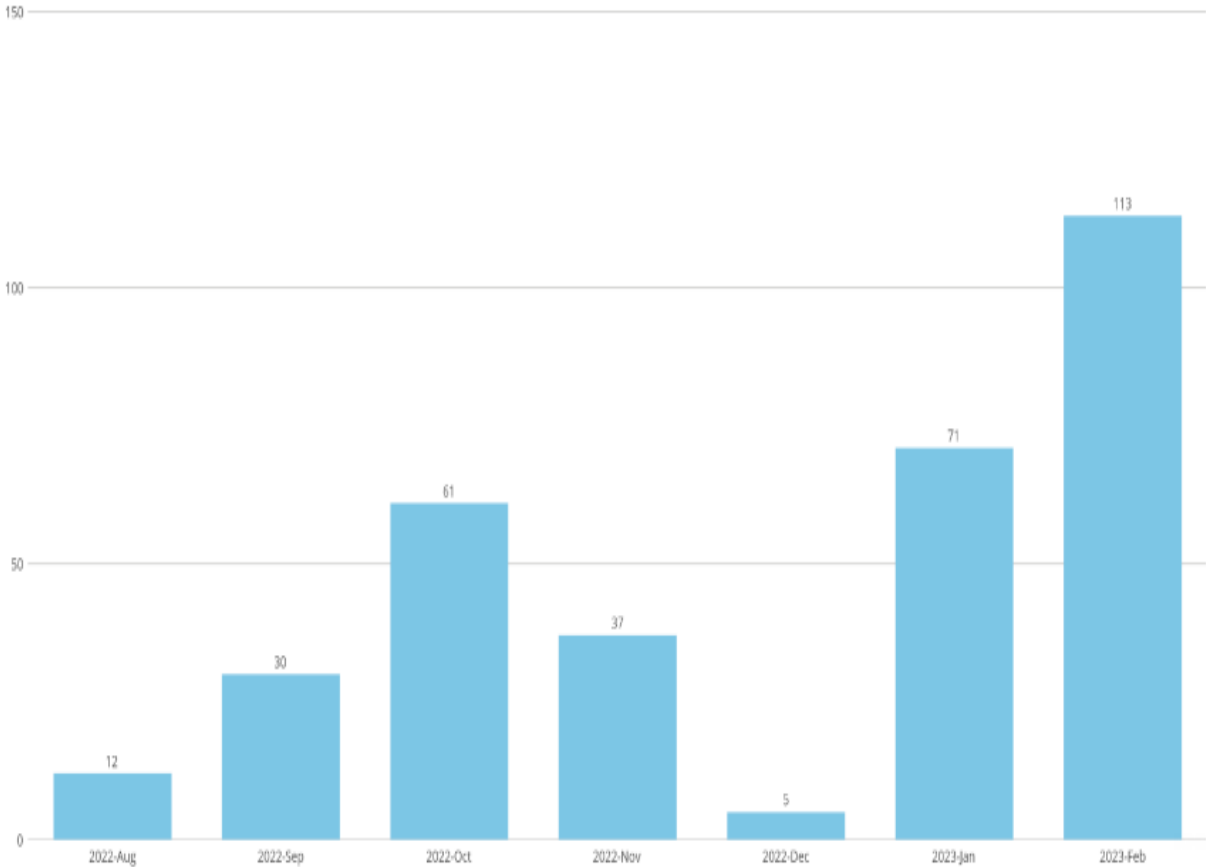
