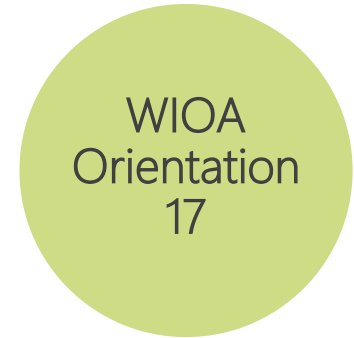

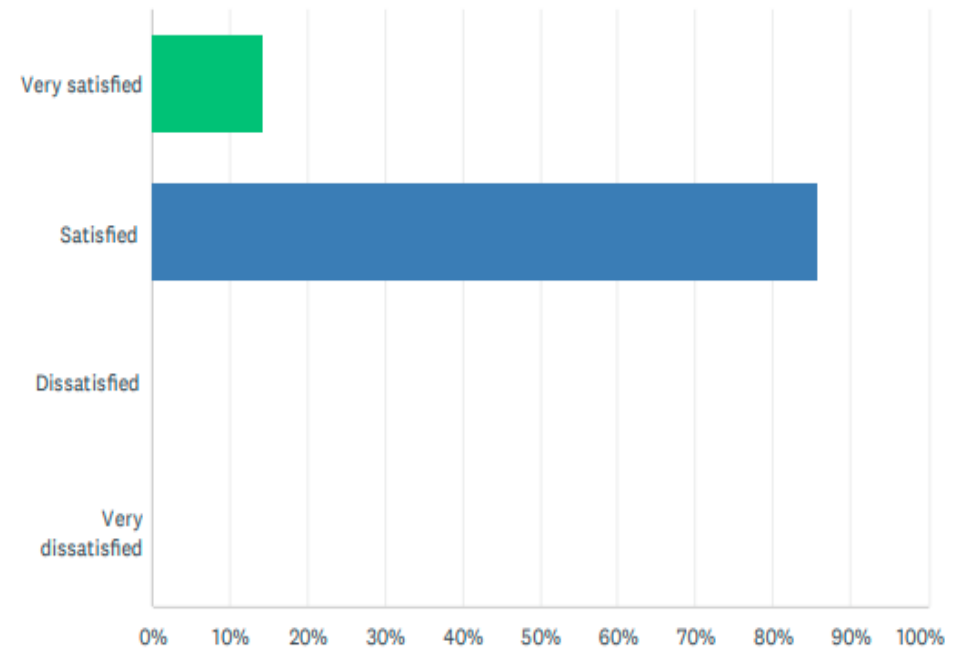

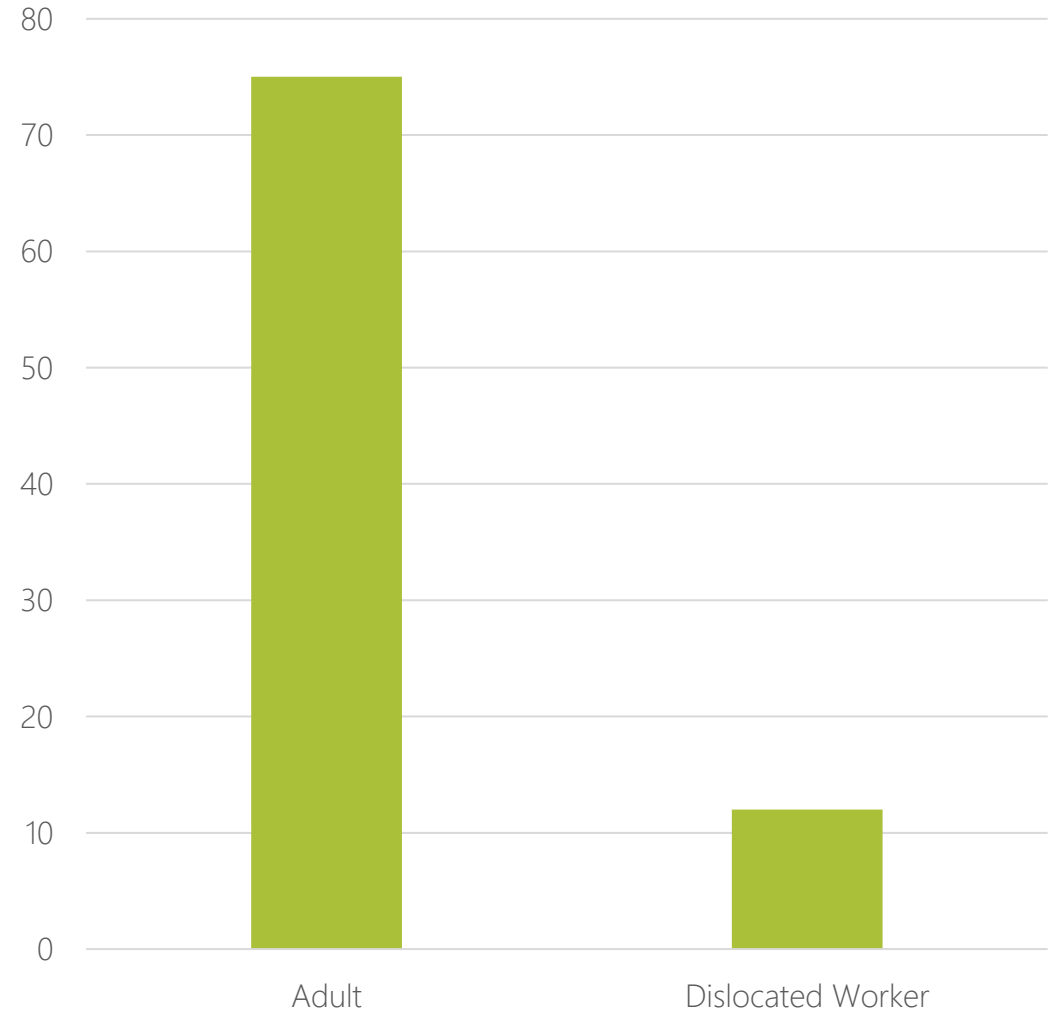

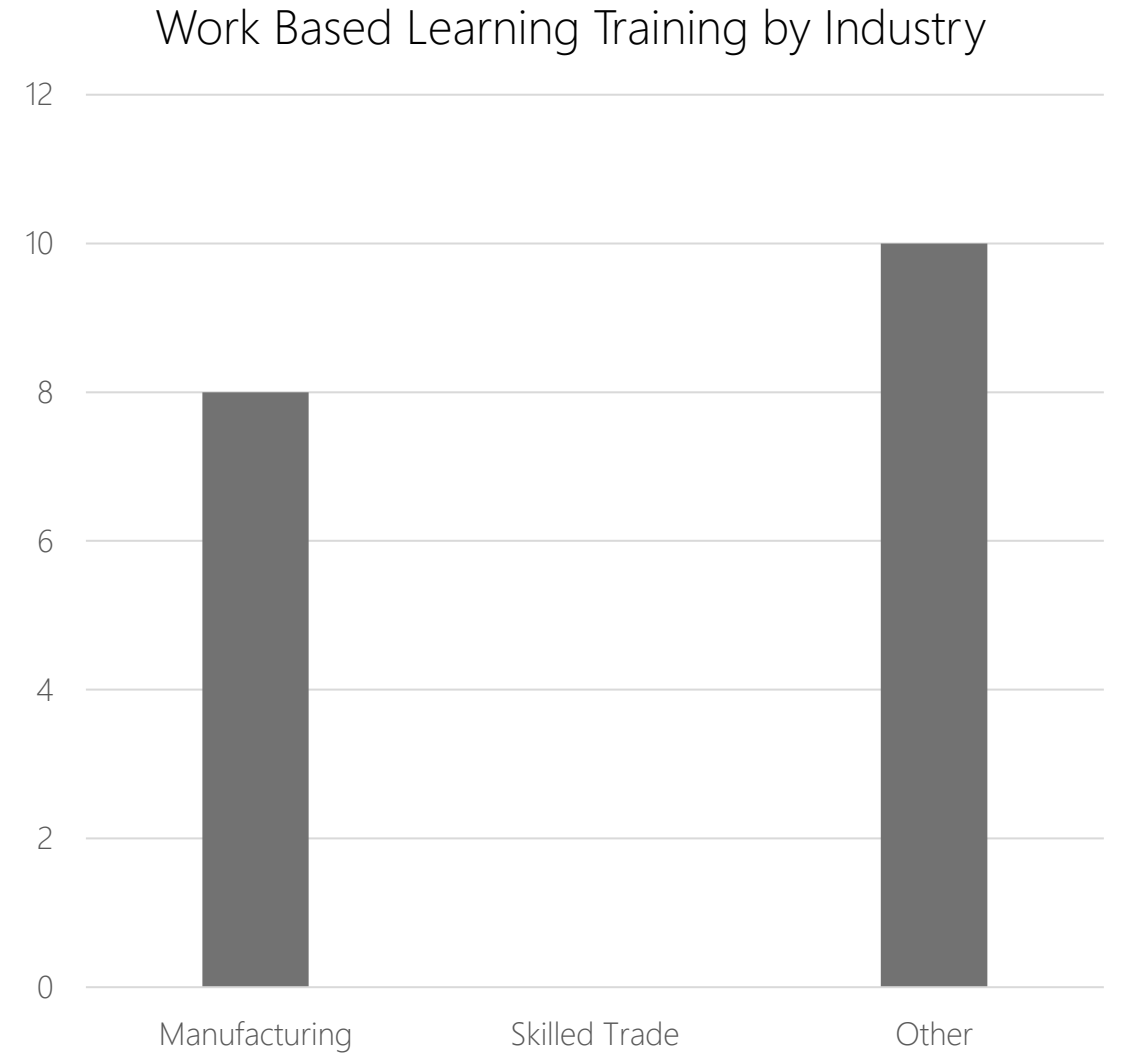


# Funding Stream Progress & Industry Percentages

## Success Story

Ms. Smith worked in manufacturing facilities throughout her adult life. She was having a difficult time branching into new career opportunities because of her work experiences. Ms. Smith had tried to alter her resume to appeal to other industries but was not receiving any new career opportunities in different fields. Ms. Smith made the decision to return to school to gain marketable skills to obtain a position within the healthcare system.

In December 2020, Ms. Smith was enrolled in the WIOA Program, where she received one-on-one career counseling. She was excited to start on the requirements of the program and begin training for SCC Advanced-Level Pharmacy Technician Certificate Program. She completed an Interest Profile, scholarship application, and her WIN assessment within a timely manner. In January 2021, she began training at Spartanburg Community College with support service assistance offered by the WIOA program.

While attending Spartanburg Community College, Ms. Smith was able to find employment within a healthcare facility making a suitable wage. She successfully completed training with Spartanburg Community College and obtained her Advanced-Level Pharmacy Technician Certificate. In July 2021, she became a Certified Pharmacy Technician. Ms. Smith received a full-time position, and a pay increase with full benefits.
