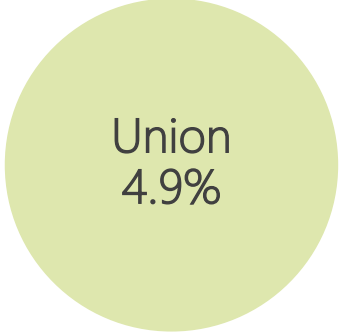

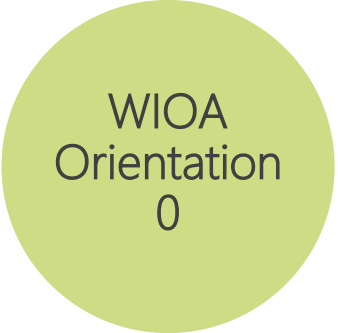
Unemployment Rates

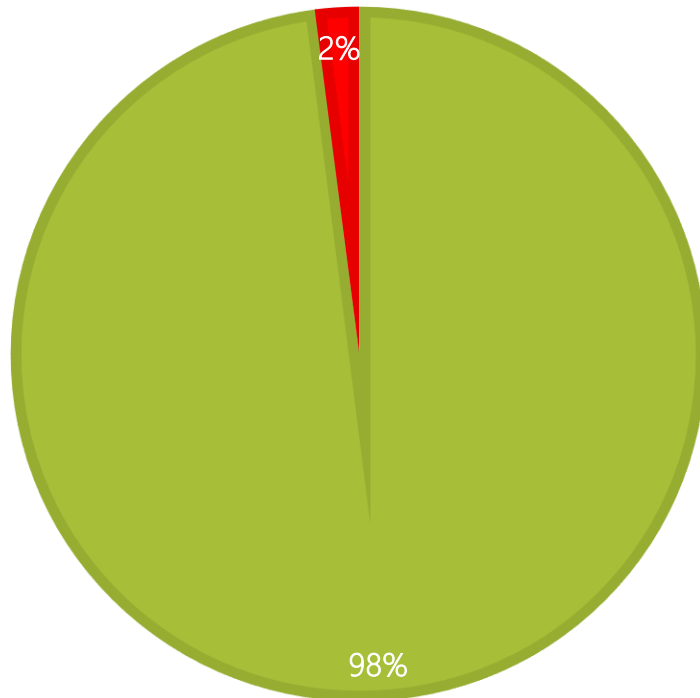

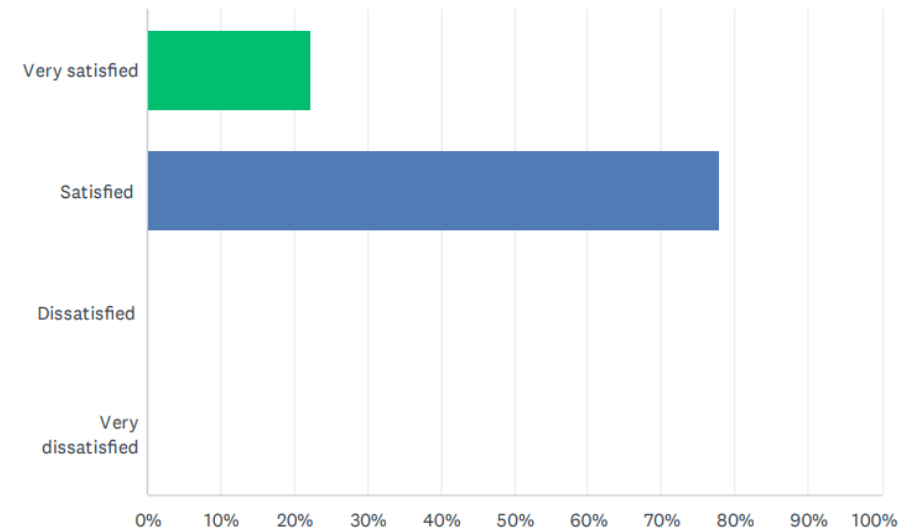

Enrollments (YTD)

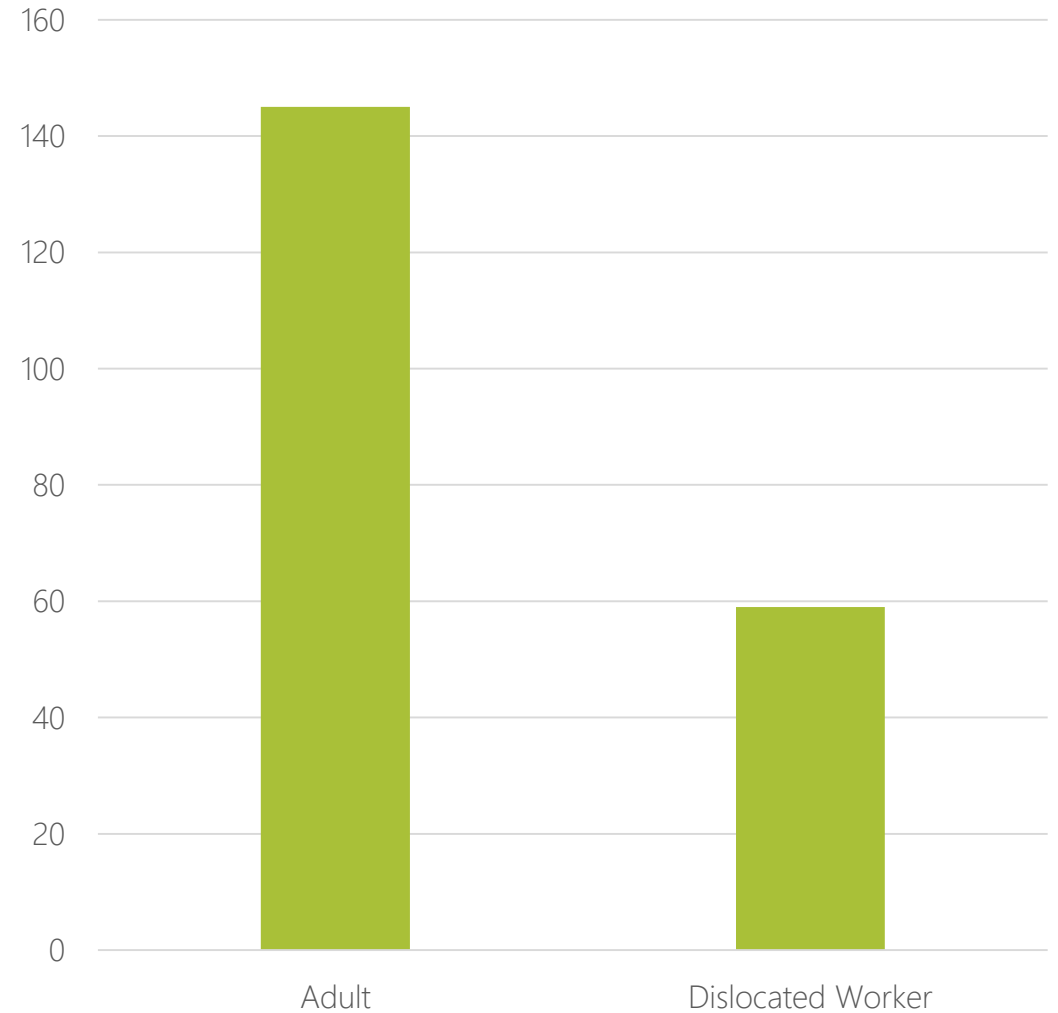

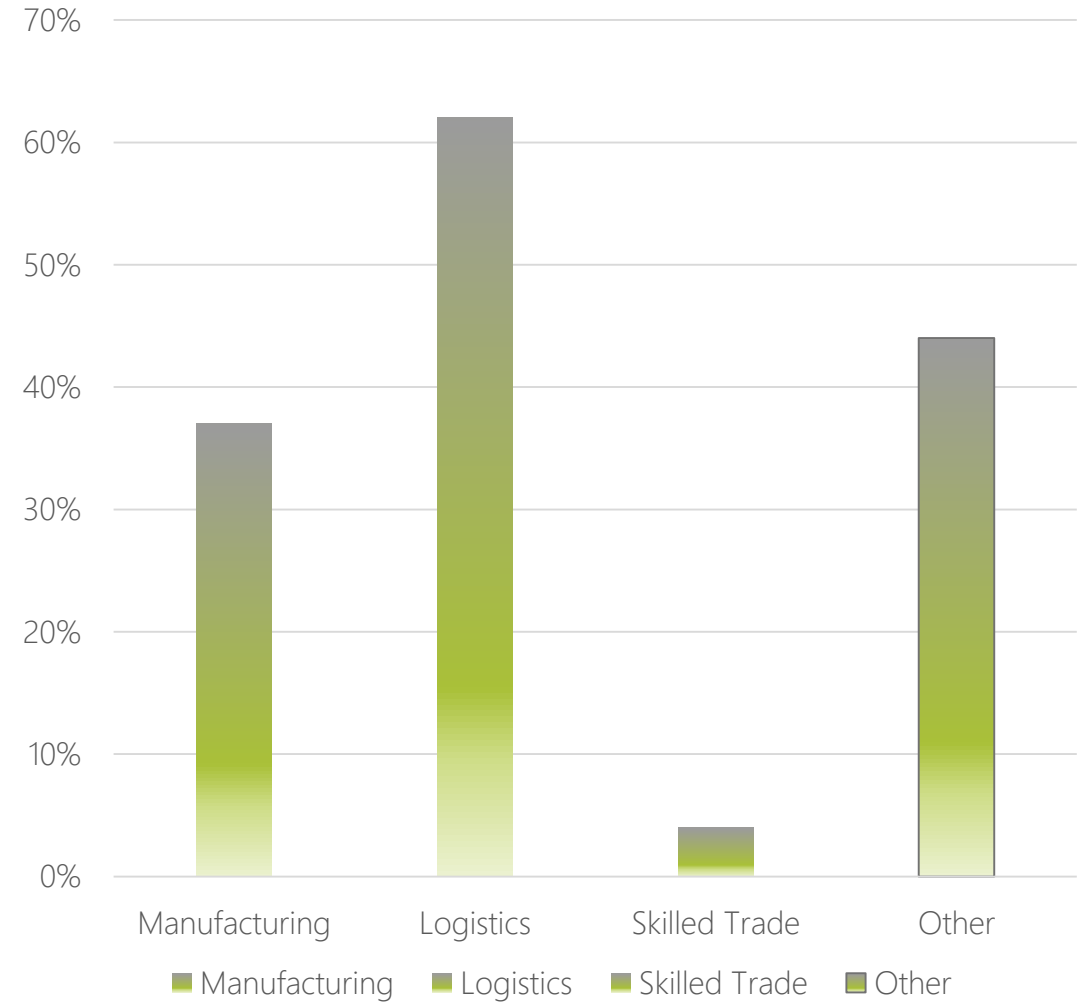
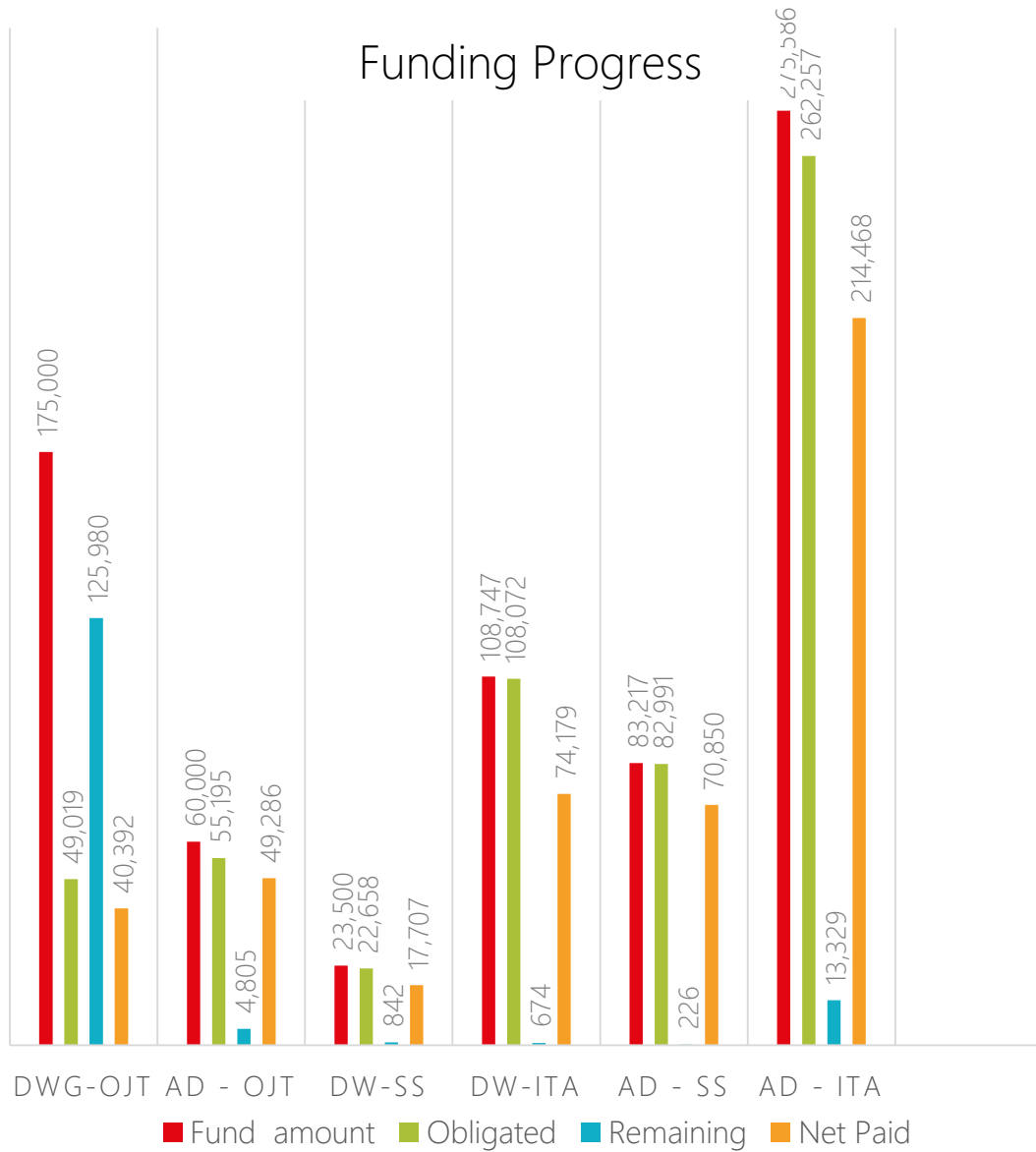

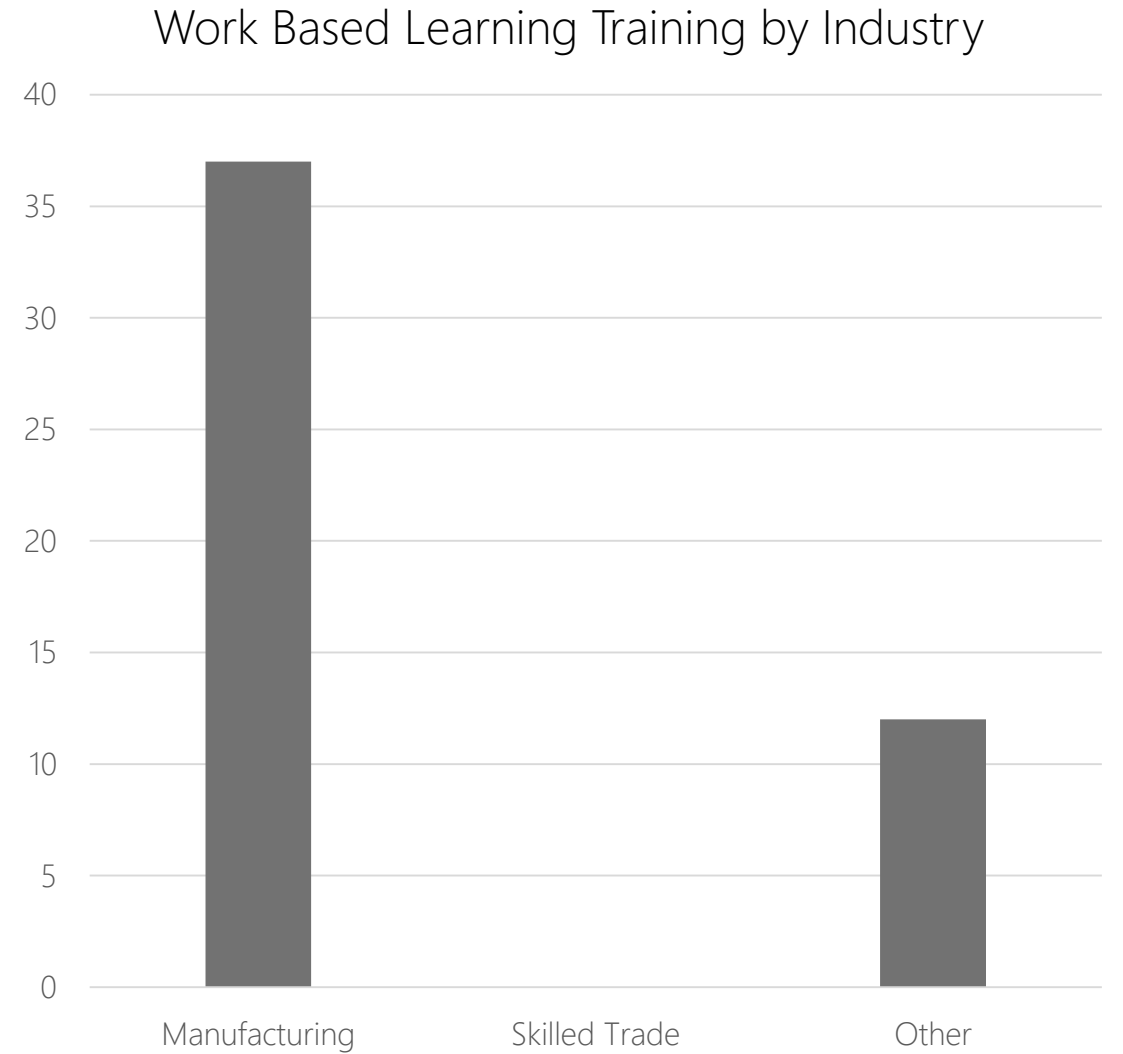


Funding Stream Progress & Industry Percentages

Funding Progress



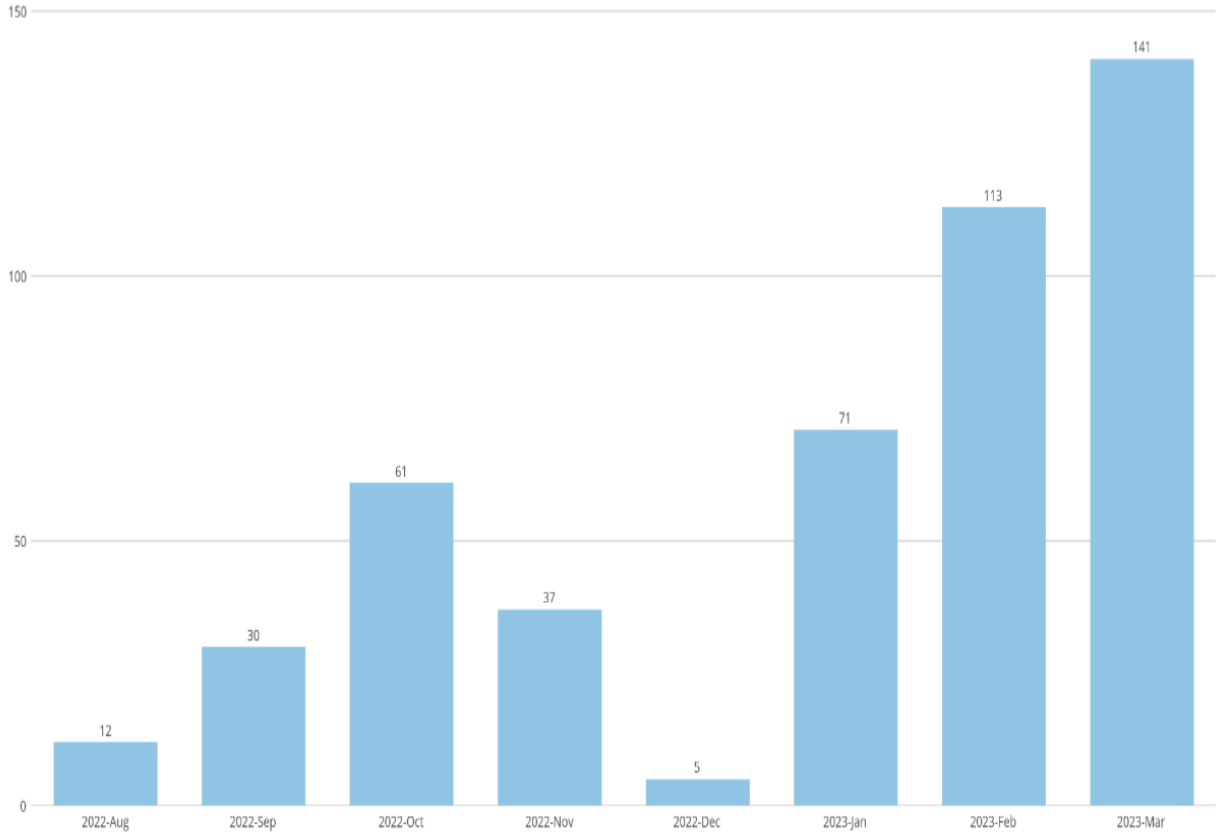

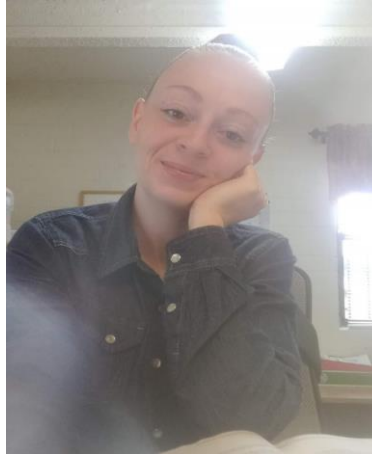

Success Story

Kayla was unemployed and looking to change the narrative of her current situation for the better good of herself and daughter. She was part of the South Carolina Foster Care system and during her youth she withdrew from school. Although she did have not a high school diploma, she was able to secure employment over the years but it often led to a dead end and no career.

Kayla reached out to the Upstate Workforce Board for employment and training services. She recognized her immediate goal was self-sufficient employment. SC Works Greater Upstate offered Kayla a 12-week Work Experience that was completed successfully. During training, Kayla assisted with the resource room, front desk and outreach. She was initially interested in property management and visited a local company that dealt in commercial property management; she quickly learned that she no longer desired to be in that field. After the successful completion of a work experience, a part-time position with SC Works became available and she accepted the position. Kayla has had years of experience in the hospitality industry and loves working with people and communities. Kayla knew that for her to reach her highest potential and earn a decent wage she would need to obtain her GED.

Kayla obtained her GED within three months. The program was able to provide financial support with testing fees and a laptop to complete any assignments. The part-time employment opportunity with SC Works has turned into a full-time role with an increase in pay.
