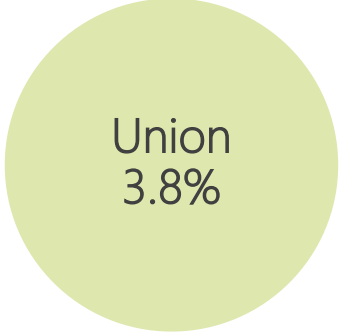

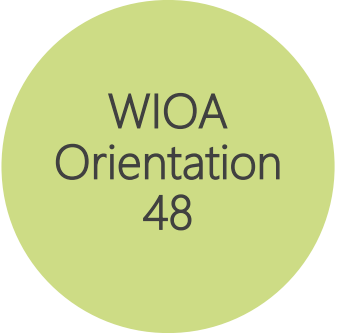
Unemployment Rates

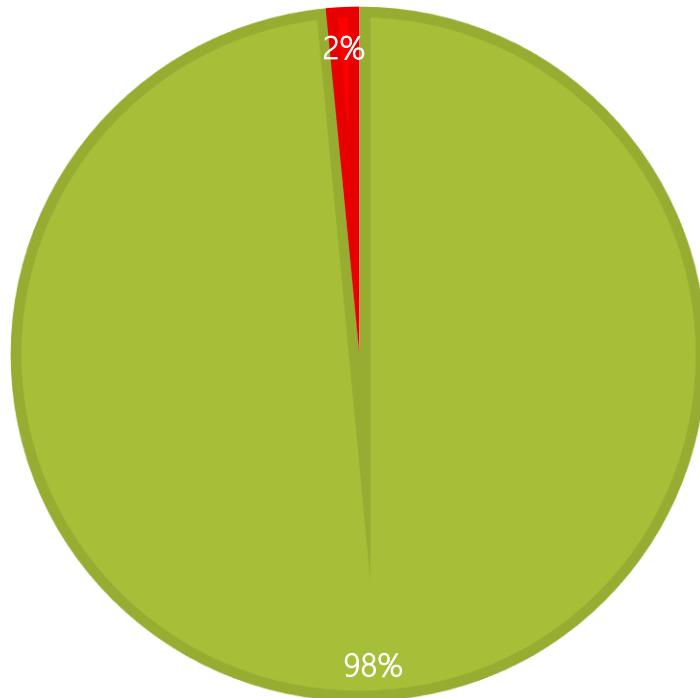

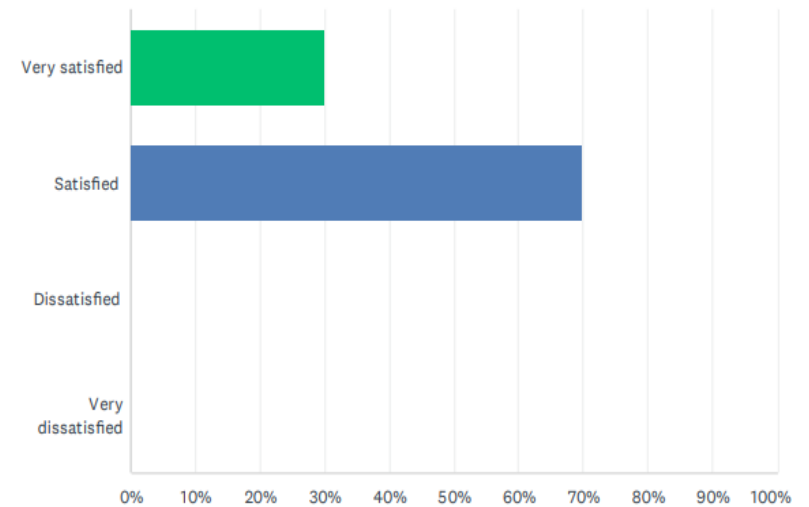

Enrollments (YTD)

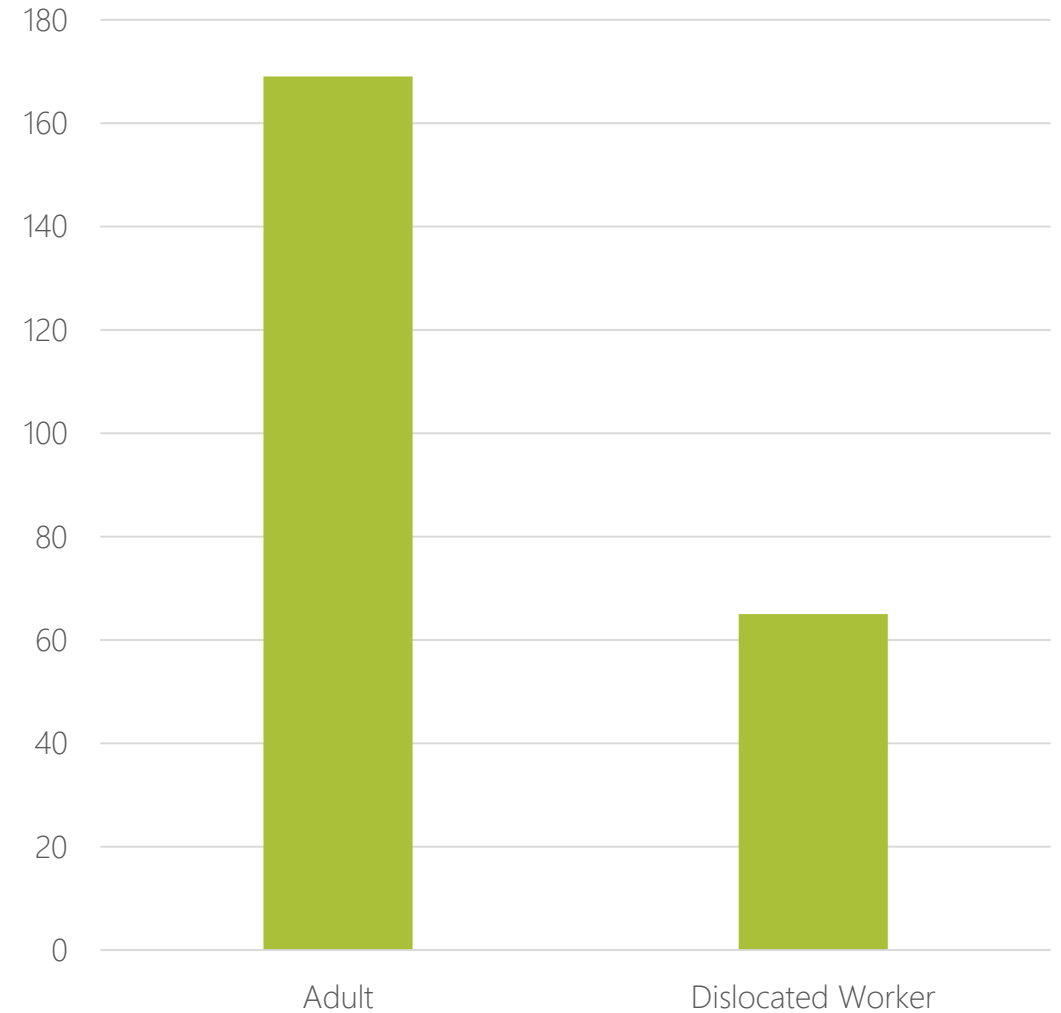

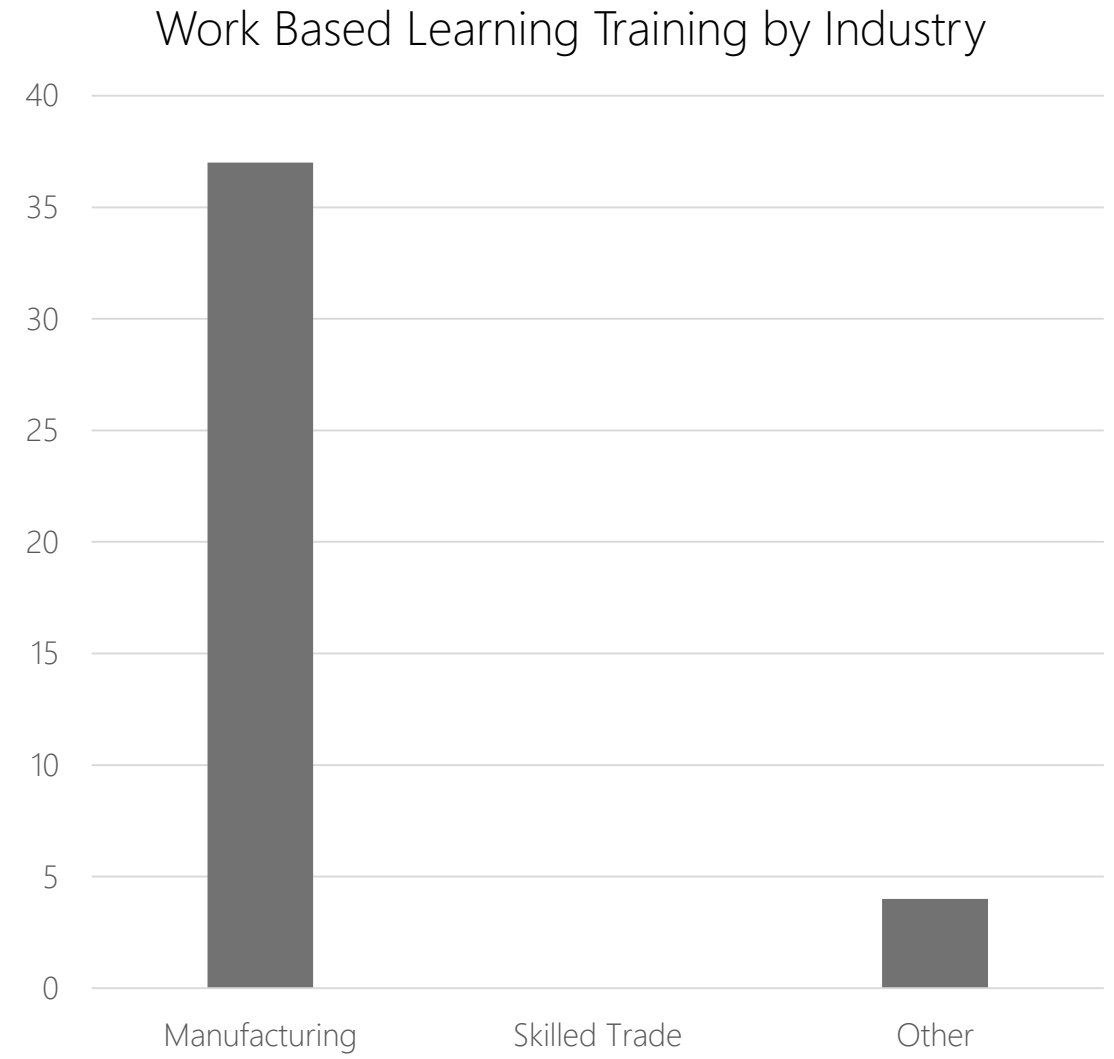


Funding Stream Progress & Industry Percentages

Whether you are the first person our clients see, the team member that ends up being a listener, or the individual that assists the client with obtaining a resolution, it is my hope that you are always aware of the impact you make. *These numbers reflect results from July 1st 2022 – May 31st 2023.

Number of clients visiting our centers = 21,793
Total number of WIOA enrolled clients served = 573
Total number of clients seeking Job assistance = 9,169
Total number of clients seeking UI assistance (including RESEA) = 12,574
During this Program Year we had 662 attend a WIOA Information Session
We offered 167 Career Readiness Workshops, with 1,321 participants
WIOA Staff enrolled 398 individuals into the program, with 222 of those already enrolled in training
3,015 individuals have attended Job Fairs/Hiring Events hosted by SC Works
