Point-in-Time (PIT) Counts are one-night counts of both sheltered and unsheltered homeless populations. The one-night counts are conducted by Continuums of Care (CoCs), and occur during the last week of January of each year. This report presents data from the 2015 PIT Count conducted by the Continuums of Care in South Carolina.

These include the:

- Lowcountry Homeless Coalition (Berkeley, Charleston, Beaufort, Colleton, Hampton, and Jasper counties);
- Midlands Area Consortium for the Homeless (Aiken, Allendale, Bamberg, Barnwell, Calhoun, Chester, Fairfield, Kershaw, Lancaster, Lexington, Newberry, Orangeburg, Richland, and York counties);
- Eastern Carolina Homeless Organization (Chesterfield, Clarendon, Darlington, Dillon, Florence, Georgetown, Horry, Lee, Marion, Marlboro, Sumter, and Williamsburg counties); and
- Upstate Homeless Coalition (Cherokee, Union, Saluda, Edgefield, McCormick, Greenwood, Laurens, Spartanburg, Greenville, Abbeville, Anderson, Pickens, and Oconee counties).

The data were collected by the CoCs and analyzed by the Master of Public Administration Program at the College of Charleston.
